

JAMESTOWN'S 400TH ANNIVERSARY

On April 26, 1607, a group of Christian colonists landed at Cape Henry, Virginia. They were part of a three-ship expedition named the Virginia Company, which founded Jamestown 400 years ago on May 14, 1607.

Robert J. Hunt, Chaplain of the British fleet, planted a large wooden cross on the wind-swept beach, offered prayers of thanksgiving, and dedicated the land to Almighty God. The colonists had prayed and fasted for three days prior to the planting of that cross on April 29th, and Hunt declared, “From these shores as we claim this day for the glory of Jesus Christ, the Gospel of God’s kingdom shall go forth to the nations.”

The story of the abandonment of Jamestown and its miraculous restoration in 1610 is one of the great providential events of world history. The settlers

Prohibitionists met June 11-12 in Arvada, Colorado to launch their 2008 Campaign by selecting candidates for the 2008 election and adopting a forward-looking platform which gives support to the war on terrorism, and to those who are defending America against the illegal alien invasion by some twelve to twenty million citizens of Mexico and of other nations.

lived on a mosquito-infested island with salt-laden water wells, without food and surrounded by hostile Indians. To make matters worse, eight more ships arrived with settlers and no food. Only 60 out of that newly arrived 600 survived the winter.

As the small group got on a boat headed back to England, with little food on board, they were facing certain death. But, they met up with the long-delayed Lord De La Warr's ship, which took the settlers back to Jamestown where the colony survived.

Why was this such an amazing event? If Jamestown had failed, the Pilgrims likely would never have been given a charter in 1620. Without the Pilgrim and Puritan believers who helped determine the basis of our Republic and our free enterprise system based on Biblical principles, there would be no America, as we know it today.

Isn't time to rededicate our nation to the Almighty God who has so greatly blessed us over these 400 years?

Editor's Note: The above article by Mr. Robert Nesbit, one of our Prohibition Boosters, is

a timely reminder of America's Biblical heritage. Many history books today try to paint most of our Founding Fathers as deists or skeptics when it is plain that most of them truly loved God and had a close relationship with their Creator. In fact, in the Declaration of Independence, they named him as the source of all our rights including the rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

Telephone Hot Line

In the 1960s social service agencies began using telephones to deal with drug and alcohol related emergencies. In a short time, crisis hot lines sprang up around the country. They varied in their approaches and techniques from place to place. Many had a trained, licensed professional as a director but were manned by trained volunteers. Some of these volunteers were college students interested in psychology, sociology, and various social sciences. Other volunteers were young or old members of society concerned about the welfare of their communities. Some had witnessed the personal and social cost of addiction, mental depression, "bad trips," overdose, or suicide. The varied backgrounds of volunteers enriched the service and added a unique stability to its operation.

The volunteers logged the specific complaints of callers. Later they shared information at regular staff meetings. They often adopted a standard approach to deal with repeat callers or certain types of callers. Not all callers were individuals in a crisis situation:

"Complaints that callers made to hot lines ranged from domestic violence to underage prostitution. Volunteers acquired general knowledge of major issues. Volunteers were trained to recognize various drugs; using *The Physician's Desk Reference* and other reference books. Callers who were afraid to call the police and youths who feared any face-to-face admission of their problem used hot lines. In some cases hot-line volunteers got callers to give them addresses and sent emergency medical aid to save lives.

Hot lines volunteers observe high standards of ethics conducts. For example, volunteers could not arrange to meet with callers they liked. Any question of a violation of policy or ethical misconduct was brought to the director's attention and the while some remained multiservice hot lines, others felt the need to specialize in suicide or rape. For troubled callers who frequently moved from one place to another and who could not find appropriate therapy, the hot line was the only source of help they could obtain. Troubled communities had a grass roots method for combating social problems. But state funding was cut and eliminated or eroded the services of most hot lines.

Today, with the multiplication of cell telephones we ought to review the benefits of hot lines and consider if there are some ways and certain areas where well organized hot lines can help troubled groups, such as youths in crisis.

COMMUNITY DEFEATS RACE TRACK

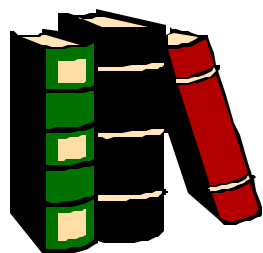

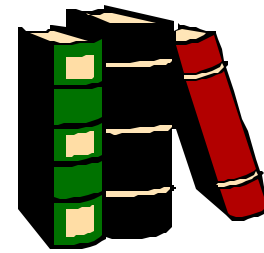
Gambling interests always boast of the taxes their operation will pay but they forget to mention the extra costs, both financial and social, which their activities will impose on the general public.

THE ETHANOL DEBACLE

Food costs in the United States rose by twenty billion dollars last year because of the ethanol craze, which is enriching some corn producers while doing nothing to supply America's energy needs. Rather than allow exploration for oil where there are vast proven reserves, such as in Alaska, Congress has given tax incentives for the production of ethanol. A great deal of energy is used to process the ethanol, and ethanol gets fewer miles per gasoline than does gasoline.

It is estimated that, as ethanol production grows, food costs will soar even higher. This is partly because corn is used to make this questionable product and what is left of the corn crop costs much more per bushel. Also, some farmers are neglecting other crops to plant those that produce ethanol. We also pay untold billions in taxes to pay for the heavy subsidies needed to sustain the ethanol industry.

We can lessen our dependence on oil from foreign lands by utilizing more clean coal, building more nuclear plants and allowing development of proven oil reserves while developing alternative energy-producing systems that are environmentally friendly and economically sound.

PLANNED PARENTHOOD-APOSTLES OF ABORTION

Margaret Sanger, founder of Planned Parenthood, was an advocate of eugenics-the policy used by Hitler to eliminate those he deemed undesirable. She admired both Hitler and Stalin for they way they removed the unwanted from this life.
